


Des LeBherz, John Sewell, Don Holland, Bob Turner — WILD CATS one of the oldest serving Clubs in the B.T.F.A.



JIM SCHAUMBERG B.T.F.A.



B.T.F.A. owes Jim most of the respect it commands today. Jim was President "from the word go" in 1973 and it was because Jim's philosophy that Brisbane should be the biggest and the best that Southern Tours were undertaken before the game caught a foothold in the rest of Queensland. Jim joins the ranks of Life Members of the oldest Association in Queensland.

Here are one or two extracts from his Annual Report in 1973 along with the Fixtures of the day.

"Since its inception in February, 1973, Brisbane Touch Association has gone ahead in leaps and bounds, from a couple of interested teams to 18 odd teams playing in Winter and Summer Fixtures plus an Annual Trophy being played for in an Interstate Series. This is progress at a remarkable rate.

"The basic idea of Touch is above all to achieve a reasonable level of physical fitness, the fellowship of other players and the many and varied social aspects of meeting after the game."

The rapid growth of Touch throughout Queensland has of course meant keen competition from all areas. However, Brisbane has not lost sight of Jim's basic ideals.
