My thanks to Delegates for their attendance at Meetings during the year and the support they have given, particularly Toowoomba Delegates who travel many miles to attend our meetings.

#### XXXX Cup:

The XXXX Cup was again conducted this year and honours went to Metropolitan — A Clean Sweep — Congratulations. There appears to be certain areas of discontent in this Competition, particularly with the Draw. If the competition is to continue and run smoothly it is suggested that a Committee under the control of S.E.Q. be established to investigate the problems associated with this competition and that Committee be responsible for running of same.

#### S.E.Q. Titles:






