The season runs from October to February and the women also have a competition during summer. Mr Ken Green of Simpson Drive Bilambil Heights is the President, Phil Smith of Dutton Street,

Coolangatta is the Treasurer and both are also our delegates to the SCTA. Representative teams are sponsored by Tooheys, and Association colours are red and white shirts and red shorts. There are currently 406 affiliated players in the TTTA.

REDLANDS TOUCH ASSOCIATION

The Redlands Touch Association has grown rapidly from an inaugural winter competition in 1979 involving 9 men's teams to a 1981 summer competition with 34 men's teams and 5 women's teams and a 1982 winter competition with 23 men's and 5 women's teams.


The total number of players has risen from about 100 in the first year to about 600 after three years. The expansion in the Association has been accompanied by an inprovement in the standard of touch being played. The growth has also led to Redlands becoming a founding member of the South Coast Touch Association which comprises the Beenleigh, Gold Coast and Twin Towns Associations as well as Redlands. The South Coast Touch Association was granted full Divisional status by the Queensland Touch Association in June 1981.

The main representative games played by Redlands are the South Coast Divisional Championship matches played against the other member Associations. At the inaugural divisional championships held at Southport in August 1981, Redlands were runner-up in the Men's Open 35, A Grade and B Grade finals. As

a result of these matches, 10 Redlands players were selected to represent the South Coast Division at the Queensland Championships held at Toowoomba in October. Of these 10, Terry Hatfield was selected in the Queensland Men's Open Team which played in the National Championships in Canberra in January, 1982. The experience gained by all the representative players has proved a great bonus to the individuals, to their clubs, and to the Association as a whole.

The Redlands Association is very fortunate to be able to conduct all of the fixture games at the one venue, and this tends to make the competition a friendly and social affair, where opposing players mix freely. As the population of the area continues to increase rapidly, it is expected that touch will also continue to prosper and cement its place as the most popular adult sport in an area renowned for its sporting facilities.

The motto of the Association is "Putting Sportsmanship back into Sport", and the fact that very few players are dismissed from the field indicates that this aim is being achieved.


